# **Planning & Zoning News**

### SDPA and WP Annual Conference

Scott Anderson (Planning Director) and Kevin Hoekman (Planner I) attended the 2017 joint conference for the South Dakota Planners Association and the Western Planners. The two organizations have joint conferences approximately every 10 years. The conference was held in Spearfish, SD from September 13 through 15.

The theme of the conference was Partners in Progress, and many of the sessions highlighted examples and methods of varied governmental and non-governmental organizations working together to plan and create better places. These partnerships (and session topics) are built in areas of economic development, state and local governments, tribal and federal government, and others.

The keynote speaker for the conference was Charles (Chuck) Marohn, the founder of <u>Strong</u> <u>Towns</u>. The core of his presentation revolved around the question 'why are cities struggling financially?' Chuck presented that cities have evolved for thousands of years around walking as the main form of transportation; the automobile change that. He also exclaimed that large successful cities started with settlers grouping businesses close together with small shacks constructed out of personal wealth and "small bets." If the small shacks were successful, then structures would be replaced by wood frame buildings, then by brick buildings, then by sky scrapers. Each increase incrementally bigger and the infrastructure would grow with it. Chuck continued that modern day development involves large upfront investments for structures and infrastructure for tenants that may or may not remain for the long term. The premise of the Strong Towns movement is that the large investments on undeveloped land are not a sustainable pattern of growth.

Other activities of the conference included networking through sessions and gatherings such as the Western Planners tradition of Wyoming vs The World softball game and the Western Planners awards ceremony. The many sessions and activities were informative and would need more space to review than this text box can hold.
